Philippine Veterans Affairs Office or PVAO Officer (Benguet-Mt. Province) Sheryllyn Sabling said in her message during the first celebration of the liberation of Tublay last May 12 this year at the municipal gym Barangay Caponga that PVAO is doing its best to support the Presidents Campaign for a “Matuwid na Daan.”

Sabling congratulates the Municipal Officers headed by Hon. Mayor Ruben E. Poad and the Sangguniang Bayan members headed by Vice-mayor Armando I. Lauro for enacting and approving such ordinance for the

first celebration of Tublay Liberation. She said that this would be a historical event in this municipality, while she was glad as well as overwhelmed to know that the LGU officials of this municipality are so much supportive of the programs and the activities of the veterans, widows, and the sons and daughters.

Sabling also encourages the veterans, as defined under Republic Act 6948 as amended by RA 7696 who haven't applied yet for PVAO benefits, to complete the requirements then submit them to their field office at Camp Allen, Baguio City.

The benefits include the Old Age Pension or OAP, Death Pension (Surviving spouse or parents), educational benefits, medical care and assistance, accrued pension, and veterans' preference.

Moreover, she also said that their field office staffs at Camp Allen are happy rendering their utmost to serve. Sabling said that there is no need for them to go directly to Manila central office just for filing. She added that the PVAO Administrator, Gen. Ernesto G. Carolina discourages claimants to go to Manila just for filing and to follow-up.

He is also serious in implementing the Anti-fixer campaign.

She said that Anti Fraud Section helps those who have difficulties in processing their documents lest they be a victim of fixers, this section also helps claimant victims file a case against these fixers.

She advises them not to sign blank forms and any affidavit statements which they know are not true. She also added that whenever they ask any office or anyone to help them in the processing of their pension, they should photocopy every document for their personal file and reference.

Sabling on the other hand takes the opportunity to explain who should be called as veteran as defined by RA No. 6948 Sec 2(a)

Tublay to Extend its S.H.I.N.E.S Program

The Municipal Nutritional Council along with the Barangay Nutritional Council of Tublay has agreed upon the extension of its S.H.I.N.E.S program.

Tublay S.H.I.N.E.S stands for Safe environment, Health and social services, Income generation, Nutritious food, Education and Stable food supply. "The program's aim is to make sure that all these categories would be improved for the welfare of the people" says Marcela Tinoyan, the Municipal Health Officer of Tublay.

The project was implemented in the year 2008 and will expire this coming December. According to Tinoyan, Tublay S.H.I.N.E.S was

formulated to lessen the increasing number of malnutrition in the said municipality. "Since 2008, we have seen the decreasing prevalence of underweight in our place so we see no reason why we should stop it" added Tinoyan.

Municipal Mayor Ruben Paoad also believes that the program must be a continous project. "We hope that once this program is extended it would result to the improvement of our community since it is a holistic and comprehensive approach" Paoad added.//

Stroke with Hypertension, number one cause of death in Tublay

The Municipal Health Office has listed 43 males and 35 females along with 2 infants who died last year. MHO reported Stroke as the leading cause of death in the municipality for the year 2011.

There were 15 reported deaths due to Cerebro-Vascular stroke last year. Senile Debility and Multiple Organ Failure were both second with 9 reported cases. Lastly, Cancer was listed as the third with 8 deaths reported.//

The enchanted Mt. Pokkong

The 1st ever successful plan of the municipality of Tublay to explore Mt. Pokkong, the highest mountain of Tublay at Ambongdolan, Tublay, Benguet was made into reality on March 1-2, 2012 by eight barangay officials, one municipal councilor, Hon. Marvin Mayos, four PNP, two barangay tanods, ten tour guides together with the Municipal Tourism Action Officer (MTAO) Enrique S. Moresto.

This lies in the tri-boundaries of Tublay-Sablan and Kapangan. The two-day trek aims to explore and document Mt. Pokong as a tourist spot and to formulate

a development plan for it.

Mt. Pokong has two peaks: one is located within the territory of Sablan with an elevation of 1488 m above sea level. Another is the located within the territory of Tublay with an elevation of 1440 m above sea level. Campsite is within the territory of Tublay with an elevation of 1440 m above sea level.

Climbing Mt. Pokong is recommended only for professional climbers, amateurs can join but with the assistance of a tour guide. Best hour to start the trek is at 8:00 am or 1:00 pm to feel the real essence of hiking due to striking heat of the sun. Hikers

should be fit in trekking to caving or rock climbing and always have a signed waiver by a guardian or any contact person. It is in joined that you include tree planting activity within the campsite to add shades in the area according to MTAO Moresto.

In hiking the mountain you will need enough drinking water, enough food except beef and corn, extra clothing, raincoats for unexpected rain, thick jackets, flashlights, medicines especially pain relievers.

According to the "lalakay" (old men) in Ambongdolan few had scaled the mountain as a tourist

spot because of the stories that goes with it. Enchanted things supposedly surround the place. One is the enchanted lake that lies on its summit, so enchanted that the lake only chooses who to show itself, thus only few of those handful who have scaled this mountain could verify its existence. Adding to the mystery is it was said that heavy rains were said to meet climbers bringing beef and corn to the mountain.

In coordination with the barangay council of Ambongdolan and with the LGU-Tublay the activity was successfully done.//

Orientation of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps)

Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program

The 4Ps is a poverty reduction and social development strategy of the National Government that provides conditional cash grants to extremely poor households to improve their health, nutrition and education particularly of children aged 0-14.

Objectives of 4ps

a. Social Assistance- to provide cash

assistance to the poor to alleviate their immediate needs (short term poverty alleviation)

b. Social Development- to break the intergenerational poverty cycle through investments in human capital.

Criteria in the selection of beneficiaries (eligible beneficiaries)

1. Residents of the poorest municipalities based on 2003 Small Area Estimates (SAE) of NSCB;
2. Households whose economic

condition is equal to or below the provincial poverty threshold;

3. Households that have children 0-14 years old and/ or have a pregnant woman at the time of assessment ; and

4. Households that agree to meet conditions specified in the program.

Proxy-Means Test. This test determines the socio-economic category of the families by looking at certain proxy variables such as ownership of assets, type of housing, education of the household head, livelihood of the family and access to water and sanitation facilities.

growth due to worm infestation and eye problems due to vitamin A deficiency. Vitamin A is one of the vitamins we should be concerned about getting enough of. Anyone who has suffered vitamin A deficiency knows of the risks that

go along with it. Blindness across the world has been linked to deficiency of vitamin A. Proper bone growth and healthy reproduction are also linked to proper vitamin A levels according to Health Fitness.

A is found in foods like carrots, spinach, and peaches. Some parents cannot go the Municipal Health Office to avail of Vitamin A and de-worming tablet for their children so the
